



Remodeled Teacher's Work Station and Lounge Area













Graduation: Behind the Scenes

Graduation ceremonies take place throughout the District in the months of May and June. Much work goes into making a graduation ceremony successful and enjoyable. Prior to graduation day the Maintenance and Operations Department begins site preparations for each ceremony.

Site preparation starts approximately a month prior to the ceremony with inspection and repair of field bleachers. The Carpentry Shop prepares the bleachers for the high traffic of family and friends that attend graduation ceremonies. The Grounds and Maintenance Shops prepare field grass, tracks and turf; water and sprinklers are turned off for the day of the ceremony. The Electrical Shop works on field lighting and setting up public address systems including microphones and speakers. The Paint Shop begins an accelerated graffiti patrol making sure to cover all graffiti that is found in the days leading up to and the day of commencement. Temporary fencing and ramps are provided on site as fields are cleared for stage set up. The stages that graduates walk across to receive their diplomas are moved and assembled by the Maintenance Shop. Chairs for the graduates are set up on the field with assistance from the Day Custodial Shop. The custodians also clean the schools and provide support for the set up and clean up of the ceremonies.

During the ceremony electricians, custodians, and staff from various departments remain on call to assist in making sure the ceremony runs smoothly.

At the end of the ceremony and after the last graduate has left the field, work begins on clearing the site. Fields are cleared of debris, stages are broken down, temporary fencing and ramps are removed and electrical systems are put away.

As a result of the hard work of Maintenance and Operation staff the graduation ceremonies are a pleasant ending to the students time spent in the District.
