6.1 Adoption of Proposed Collective Bargaining Agreement and Settlement Agreement Between the District and the San Bernardino Teachers Association (Prepared by Employee Relations Department)

The current collective bargaining agreement between the San Bernardino Teachers Association (SBTA) and the District expired on June 30, 2003. Over the past several months, the District and the SBTA have conducted 14 bargaining sessions on a successor collective bargaining agreement.

A tentative, three-year agreement has been reached and has been ratified by the SBTA membership. The tentative agreement provides for a .5 percent base salary increase. The tentative agreement provides for the following additional changes:
