 - 3. Inspect for damaged wood wherever plaster has been removed. Replace or repair damaged wood accordingly, approximately 250 lineal feet.
 - 4. Repair/patch wood members at areas opened up for destructive testing.
 - 5. Remove and dispose of plaster as needed to repair missing plaster at soffits,
 - 6. Install new metal shim stock, building paper, lath, plaster and bottom edge moulding at soffits and canopy edges.
 - 7. Patch affected roof portions. Repair approximately 300 square feet of built-up roofing.
 - 8. Replace affected flashing and splice wood fascia sub-frame where necessary.
 - 9. Work includes replacement of existing gutter and downspout with new gutter and downspout as where shown on plans.

- 7. Surface Preparation for Exterior Metal (Except Galvanized): Preparation in accordance with SSPC-6 Commercial Blast Cleaning.
- 8. Metal Surfaces: checked, cracked, blistered, scaled, loose, peeling and alligatored paint on metal surfaces shall have the paint removed down to bare metal, then hand sanded and dusted clean. Feather the existing surfaces into the adjacent surface to maintain proper alignment and finish.
 - a. Remove peeling and loose paint by scraping. Taking care not to damage sound wood and profiles.
- 9. Work by experienced skilled craftsmen only. Surface preparation shall be in accordance with standards of the Painting and Decorating Contractors of America. Apply finishes evenly and be free from runs, sags, crawls, or other defects
- 10. Uncoated Steel and Iron Surfaces: Remove grease, scale, dirt and rust. Where heavy coatings of scale are evident, remove by wire brushing or sandblasting; clean by washing with solvent. Apply a treatment of phosphoric acid solution, ensuring weld joints, bolts and nuts are similarly cleaned. Prime paint after repairs with Tnemec Series L69 Hi Build Epoxoline II or Carboline 890 VOC or approved in accordance with Division 01, General Requirements for Substitutions.
- 11. Shop Primed Steel Surfaces: Sand and scrape to remove loose primer and rust. Feather edges to make touch-up patches inconspicuous. Clean surfaces with solvent. Spot prime bare steel surfaces to match existing primer.
- 12. Previously Coated Surfaces: Painting over existing painted surfaces exterior, ascertain that new paint system is compatible with existing gloss and high-gloss oil based paint system to insure proper adhesion. Sand lightly existing paint and prime walls as scheduled.
- 13. Protect elements surrounding the Work of this Section from damage or disfiguration.
- 14. Repair damage to other surfaces caused by Work of this Section.
- 15. Furnish drop cloths, shields and protective methods to prevent spray or droppings from disfiguring other surfaces.
- 16. Apply products in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
- 17. Do not apply finishes to surfaces that are not dry.
- 18. Apply each coat to uniform finish. Number of coats specified is a minimum. Additional coats shall be applied at no extra cost, if coatings show evidence of uneven application, uneven pigmentation, brush strokes or otherwise unsatisfactory distribution of material.
- 19. Under coats shall be lighter and brighter in tint than finish coat.
- 20. Sand lightly between coats to achieve required finish.
- 21. Allow applied coat to dry before next coat is applied.
- 22. Exterior fascia, trims, reveals, and ornamental fences and gates shall receive accent paint colors different from field paint color.

G. CLEANING: As Work proceeds, promptly remove paint where spilled, splashed, or spattered.


