



Responses and Clarifications
To the Request for Proposals No. 93 Professional Consulting Services for
Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) Services

Q1.A. Please amplify the intent/requirement of the training mentioned in the Master Service Agreement, Exhibit A, pg. 2, Item h).

A1.A. The intent of the training is to provide overall education on the requirements of the State on Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) Program. Likewise, the training would highlight ways to prevent pollution and prevention tactics. The process to accomplish the training is determined by the consultants including but not limited to compact disc (CD) training, workshops or pamphlets.

Q1.B. Is this task and the requirements of Item # 4(uncertain of the effort required) to be included in what appears to be a lump sum estimate for each of the three school sizes?

A1.B. Yes, the consultant should consider these requirements in providing the cost proposal.

Q2. Article 10 Indemnification. We request to add the word **negligent** to this paragraph so it reads: "... arising out of the performance of the services herein rendered by the CONSULTANT or caused by any error, omission or **negligent** act of the CONSULTANT or of any person employed by the CONSULTANT or of any others for whose acts the CONSULTANT is legally liable."

A2. Accepted.

Q3. Should the cost for laboratory tests be considered and listed in the Reimbursable Expenses section, though they're not really in that category? They will be invoiced and paid on a unit cost basis.

A3. The laboratory tests should be listed under the Reimbursable Expenses section.

Q4. Do you confirm the requirement that 3 years experience in K-12 public school projects is required and therefore limit access?

A4. The District hereby waives the 3 year experience requirement in the RFP. All proposers are advised to submit their qualifications with or without any K-12 public school experience. No penalty will be assessed on proposers without K-12 experience.
