New Campus

The modernization of existing buildings at Indian Springs High School is about to conclude. Work on several of the new buildings are about to be completed as well. Meanwhile, preparations for six new campus sites are almost completed as pre-construction work is wrapping up.

Indian Springs High School


Out in the field, fencing for the baseball diamonds have gone up. Construction on what will be the locker rooms is the furthest along of the new buildings and is nearly completed. Several other structures that are also further along in construction are having coats of stucco and paint applied to their exteriors. In front of the locker rooms, the new gymnasium recently had a new roof deck installed.

Modernization work is almost completed on the old Curtis Middle School site. New flooring and ceiling systems are all that remain to be installed inside. New casework has been installed inside all of the remodeled classrooms.

Demolition to Laying Groundwork for New Campuses

Pre-construction work taking place at six future campus sites throughout the District are starting to wrap up, leading to construction scheduled to start next year. All of the structures that existed at Brown, Norton, Henry, and Gomez Elementary Schools and Middle College High School have been taking down and debris removed. The process of removing foundations, along with other types of underground demolition and soil remediation, continues. In the meantime, abatement is completed and demolition work is in progress at Dominguez Elementary School. Once all of the pre-construction tasks have been completed, construction will begin at various times throughout next year, leading to the completion of each campus approximately 18 months later.

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Modernization

As several modernization projects are making the final push towards completion, two new groups of projects, taking place at San Bernardino HS and four elementary schools, have started moving classes into interim housing, with demolition work imminent.

Group 1


At both Lincoln ES and Riley ES, the Administration portion of each campuses' main building are undergoing modernization work, starting with abatement. Work on classrooms in other wings of the building have recently been completed and classes have resumed. At Salinas Creative Arts, recently installed fire alarms are being tested. Once finished, this will complete work at this campus.

Group 2

At Mt. Vernon ES, classes have moved into interim housing and the first phase of construction has begun. Abatement and demolition has been completed inside the first building and the process of rebuilding has started.

Group 3

Work has started on the last of the buildings to be modernized at San Gorgonio HS, Building A, which includes the Administration and science classes. Demolition and abatement work has already been completed inside. The project will conclude during the first quarter of the new year.

Group 4

At Carmack ES, the first two classrooms have been completely remodeled and classes are starting to be held inside. The Administration area has also been updated with new casework and paint. Currently, another set of two classrooms are undergoing construction. At Arrowhead ES, both Buildings A and C are undergoing modernization work, with part of Building A already completed. And at Kendall ES, work inside Building D is almost finished.

Group 5

Modernization work at Hillside ES is reaching the end, with the administration offices moving back into the recently remodeled Building A. At Hunt ES, the modernization portion of work is completed, with additional work to start in December. The goals for this additional work include upgrading the Administration building, kitchen, and parking lot.

Group 6

All of the campuses in Group 6 are completed with construction work and are undergoing final punch list items before modernization work is completed.

Group 7

Interim housing is currently being setup at Ramona-Alessandro ES. At Marshall ES, work on the Administration building has started. Work has also started on Building A at Bradley ES. Smaller sitework projects are occurring throughout the three campuses.

Group 8

Work has started on the modernization project at San Bernardino HS. Interim housing is in the process of being established. The scope of work for this project includes: Building B being reconfigured with Science, Math, & Business

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Labs; relocating the ceramics, floral, and bakery classes from Building B to Building M to create an "Arts Village"; replacing the central plant with new energy efficient equipment; remodeling the Administration & Cafeteria buildings to better define entries and foster eating on campus; installing new roofs at several buildings; and fire, life, safety, and security upgrades, as well as ADA upgrades and restroom remodels throughout the campus.

Group 9

Work continues at Richardson Prep, with new door frames being placed inside Building B at Richardson Prep. Demolition work has started at Lytle Creek ES. At Inghram ES, new shear walls are in the process of being installed at one of the buildings. Modernization work will begin at Serrano and Urbita after the holiday break.

Group 10

Inside Building B at Cypress ES, modernization work is nearly completed. The next building that will be worked on will be Building C. Some demolition work continues at Cole ES inside Buildings E and H. Plumbing lines in the walls are in the process of being modified to better suit the classrooms. At Highland-Pacific ES, new and refinished casework are being placed, along with new coats of paint on the walls, inside Building B and C.

Group 11

Modernization work has started for this group of campuses. All of the schools in this group are receiving: new interior finishes; new Administration configurations; lighting & ceiling, fire, life, safety and security upgrades; and teaching walls and integrated technology and data systems. ADA upgrades and restroom remodels throughout each campus are also planned.
