


PROGRAM SUMMARY


Program Costs

The total program cost estimate is a working budget for all capital costs for the projects in the Facilities Capital Improvement Program. The Facilities Capital Improvement Program cost estimate is valued at \$1.728 billion. This estimate is based on the number of projects, actual costs realized, established funding and cost escalation added over time. This cost is subject to change as a result of the financial status of the District and due to the availability of state and local funding. The number of projects may adjust if necessary as

District needs evolve, projects are prioritized, and funding becomes available. There are over 330 major capital improvement projects identified in the estimate based on repairs, modernizations and new school needs in the District.

A total of \$1.3 billion in funding has been received as of December 31, 2023, including funds from statewide bonds, local bonds, Qualified School Construction Bond (QSCB), interest, developer fees and development agreements.





Program Schedule

The Facilities Capital Improvement Program includes over 330 projects which have progressed through phases of the school construction process. These phases are 1) Planning, 2) Design, 3) Agency Review/Approval, 4) Bid/Award, 5) Construction and 6) Project Completion/Closeout.

Planning - The planning phase includes project definition, consultant selections, funding and, if applicable, site selection.

Design - The Design Phase includes preparation of plans and specifications by architects and engineers.

Agency Review/Approval - The Agency Review/Approval Phase includes submission of documents to Division of the State Architect (DSA) for review and stamped approval.

Bid/Award - The Bid/Award Phase includes advertising, bidding, awarding and contract execution for the construction contractors.

Construction - The Construction Phase includes demolition and abatement of existing structures and/or equipment, on- and off-site development, school buildings construction, interior finishes and landscaping through substantial completion.

Project Completion/Closeout - The Project Completion/Closeout Phase includes contract closeout documents such as equipment manuals with occupancy, move-in and the filing of notice of completion activities.



The Facilities Capital Improvement Program cost estimate is valued at \$1.728 billion. The distribution of the total program cost estimate according to project type is illustrated in "Total FCIP Cost Estimate". The project estimates typically include two types of costs soft and hard costs. Soft costs are for indirect costs to support the construction process and include costs for planning and design services, permits and agency fees, inspection services, construction managers, and program management. New construction projects may also require acquisition of land, in which case the costs to purchase land, relocate tenants or owners, environmental clearing and agency approvals are also added to the soft costs. Hard costs are direct costs for construction including labor for the trade contractors, building materials and equipment. The Program Management Team updates the total program cost estimate based on actual bids received for construction, contracts awarded for consultants and a trend of fees and other costs for each project.


Expenditures by Project Type

Expenditures as of December 31, 2023 total \$1.24 billion for the over 330 capital projects in the Facilities Capital Improvement Program. These costs are managed by the Program Management Team using Primavera Contract Manager Project Management System. Arts Projects

San Bernardino HS - Auditorium Modernization

The San Bernardino High School Theatre is getting a fresh new look and feel to help our students really shine on that stage! Upgrades will include an optimized stage, band room, choir room as well as a new ticket booth, concession stand, restrooms and manager's office. Plus, all parts of the facility will have easier ADA access.

Athletic Complex Improvements

San Gorgonio High School Tennis Courts have been remodeled with all new Fencing, Windscreen with SGHS Graphics, Athletic Surfacing and Striping for a fresh new look.

Lighting has been added to the baseball field, softball field, tennis courts and pool areas. The additional lights brighten both areas dramatically and allow student sport activities to take place later in the day after sundown.

Nutrition Services Freezer Repair

SBCUSD Child Nutrition Services Center is receiving a New Ceiling for the Central Freezer. The Ceiling for the 6,000+ SF Freezer is being removed and replaced with New Ceiling Panels and Emergency Battery Backup Lighting.

Paakuma K-8 - Classroom Expansion

A new classroom building with a focus on Fine Arts, including a large band room, Media broadcast room, Art classroom and workroom, and two regular classrooms. These new spaces were occupied as of October 2023.

• Public Safety Building - Demolition

This new District Police Headquarters will help equip our public safety officers with the best facilities - to ultimately ensure our students have a safe education space.

Roof Replacement @ M&O and Warehouse

These two buildings received a new roof, roof drains, and gutters to protect the structure from water intrusion, Additionally, the warehouse building received seven large ceiling fans to improve the comfort of staff. In the summer of 2024 new swamp coolers will be installed to further improve the comfort for the warehouse staff.

Welcoming Resource Center

This new, state-of-the-art multi-story Parent Engagement Center is intended to provide a variety of resources and services to parents - from enrollment, health and community services.


• Pacific HS - Modernization
